In 1861, when a railway Riga–Daugavpils was built, Riga's residents started to build summer cottages here. In 1862 Ogre became a health resort.

Bulduri Technical School

1. Digitalisation / smart / E-gardening
2. Knowledge triangle – Education and Training, Research, Business/ Entrepreneurship

Bulduri Technical School is a professional secondary education school in Bulduri, the oldest school in Latvia with a focus on horticulture. Bulduru Technical School is located in the territory of the ancient Bilderliņi crown manor on the banks of Lielupe, near the sea. Since 1910, future specialists in the field of horticulture and horticulture have been educated in this place. Nowadays, this school also prepares young specialists in the tourism, hospitality and catering industries!

Latvian University of Life Sciences and Technologies

Latvian University of Life Sciences and Technologies, previously Latvian Agricultural University (LLU), is a university of biosciences and technologies that implements research and study programs in biosciences, engineering sciences and social sciences. Due to the proportionally large number of university students, Jelgava, the city where the university is located, is sometimes called the student capital of Latvia. The university specializes in forestry, agriculture, horticulture and veterinary science.



Option 3**Riga State Technical School (RVT)**

Professional Education Competence Centre Riga State Technical School (RSTS) is the most versatile vocational education competence centre in Latvia. At the moment 39 accredited vocational education programmes are being implemented in RSTS. In 14 different vocational secondary education programme groups, as well as professional development and further education programmes. There are more than 2000 students in RSTS.



Option 4**Riga Tourism and Creative Industries School (RTRIT)**

1. Culinary heritage and international networking
2. Artificial Intelligence

Riga Tourism and Creative Industries School offers professional secondary and vocational education programs for both primary and secondary school graduates - in the department of food production and catering, in the department of hospitality, tourism and commercial sciences or in the department of fashion, style and design. With approximately 2000 students, currently, this is one of the largest vocational education institutions in Latvia.



Option 5**Riga Media and Art School (RMMT)**

1. Arts and Crafts for sustainable development (including restoration)

Riga Art and Media Technical School is a modern professional education institution. A place where age-old art meets modern technology. School specializes in the art industry, training students in video, photography, animation, web design, wood and metal artistic processing, textile and clothing design and many other areas.



Option 6**Vidzeme Technical School of Technology and Design – Agriculture and Innovation**

Vidzeme Technical School of Technology and Design unites two professional schools - Priekuļi Technical School and Cēsis Technology and Design High School. 	<p><i>Smiltene Technical School is the only educational institution in Latvia that offers young people the opportunity to learn veterinary professions after graduating from primary school. At the school, it is also possible to learn horticulture, hospitality and catering, processing of wood materials and other professions in demand on the labour market. The school's students improve their professional knowledge in the school's veterinary training clinic equipped with the latest equipment, hotels, a training restaurant, a simulator classroom and a training ground built by the students themselves.</i></p>
