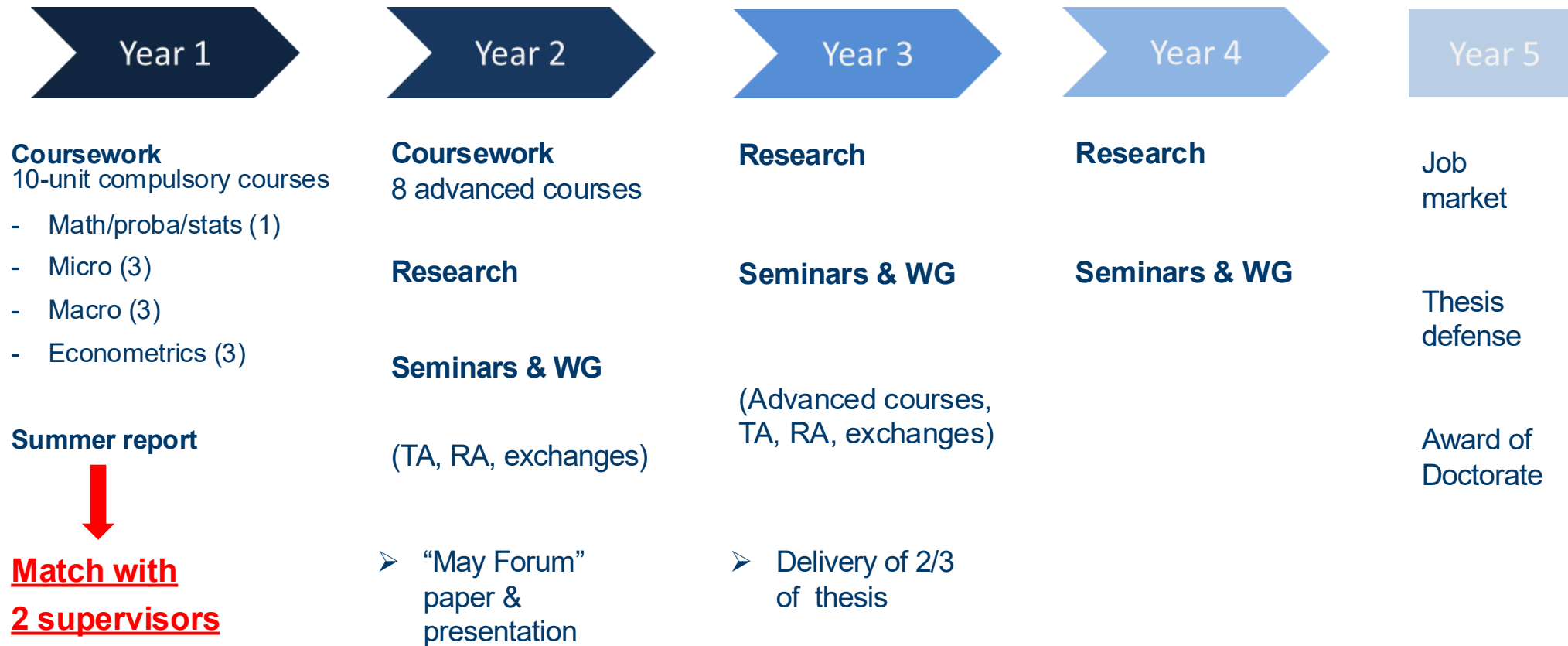

# About the EUI

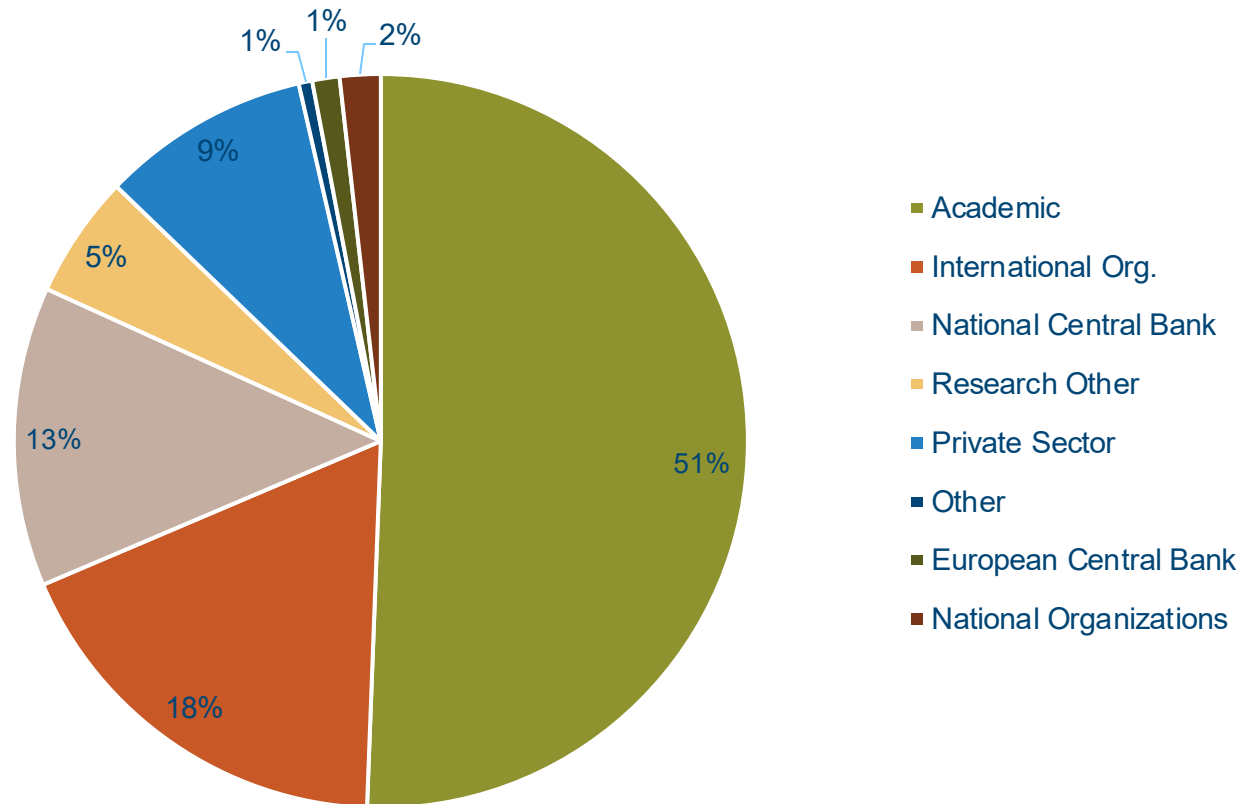
- Founded in 1972 by Benelux, France, Germany, Italy

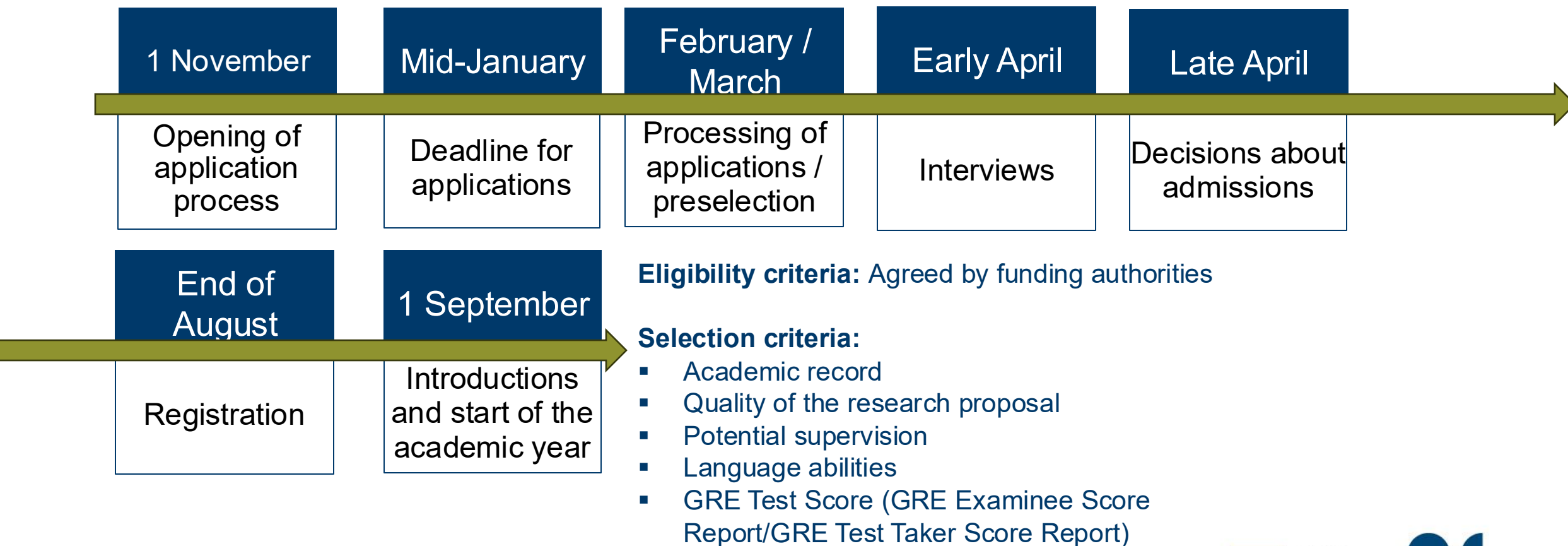
# Seminars and working groups

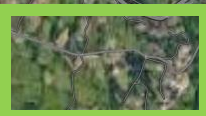
