- International organisation founded in 1972 (opened since 1976), based in Florence, Italy
- 23+2 Member States
- Focus on research and doctoral training
- Disciplines: Political Science and Sociology, Economics, History, and Law
- No bachelor's or master's students (exception: master's in economics, STG)
- Crucial role in equalizing opportunities for doctoral research across the EU






How satisfied are you overall with your supervisor?

Well-funded


- PhD grants paid in regular monthly intervals

Structure of the programme







Structure of the programme (cont.)

- Four-year programme
- Doctoral research and coursework (seminars and workshops)
- Progress is assessed each year
- Expectation: active participation in the academic life of the institute



Programme milestones

- First year
 - Write thesis prospectus
 - Take seminars and workshops worth 110 credits
- Second year
 - Submit draft of 25% of the thesis + present
 - Take seminars and workshops worth 60 credits
- Third year
 - Submit draft of 2/3 of the thesis
- Fourth year
 - Submit draft of full thesis
- Fourth / fifth year
 - Defend





First year: Coursework

- 110 credits of coursework
 - Seminars: during the first two terms
 - "Field seminars": Soc, Comp Pol, IR, Pub Pol Ins
 - 1 is compulsory
 - Methods seminars
 - 2 are compulsory (1 in quantitative and 1 in qualitative methods
 - "Research seminars": topical, specialized
 - Workshops: focused on specific methods or topics, usually in the third term,
- You can take seminars in the other departments (and even partner universities)



Missions, exchanges, fieldwork

- The department has funding to support research missions
 - Conferences, extra training, etc.
 - From second year onwards
- Exchange programmes
 - Second or third year
 - Agreements with NYU, Wisconsin, CEU, LSE, Sciences Po, Humboldt...
- Funding for data collection, experiments, etc.



Academic life

- Endless opportunities
- Literally thousands of seminars, workshops, colloquium meetings, and guest lectures every year. https://www.eui.eu/events
- Most supervisors organize research colloquia for their supervisees and others
- Researchers can also organize their own working groups



Application and Selection

Introductions and start of the academic year

- Quality of the research proposal
- Potential supervision
- Language abilities
- GRE (only for Department of Economics)
